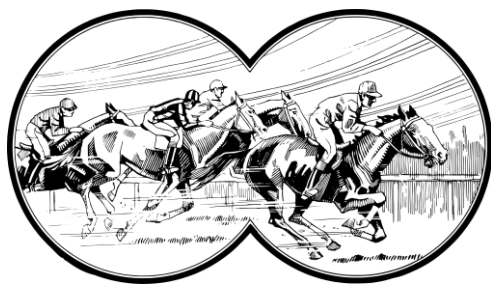

Can you help Lida Lott find the murderer?



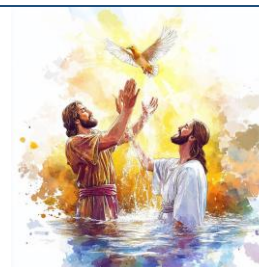

Thought for the week: Epiphany: Hannah, Mary, and the Revelation of Jesus.

The season of Epiphany invites us to reflect on how God makes himself known, often in unexpected ways. Two songs from Scripture, Hannah's prayer in 1 Samuel and Mary's Magnificat, help us understand what is being revealed about God in Jesus. Hannah's song comes from a woman who had known years of hardship. She speaks of a God who overturns human expectations: the strong are brought low, the weak are strengthened, the hungry are filled, and the poor are lifted up. Her words describe not just her own experience, but the way God acts in the world. Mary's song echoes Hannah's centuries later. As she prepares to give birth to Jesus, she recognises that God is once again at work among the lowly and the overlooked. In her words, we hear clearly what kind of life Jesus will live and what kind of kingdom he will bring. Epiphany is about recognition. Through these songs, we see that Jesus reveals a God of mercy and justice, whose power is shown not in force or spectacle, but in compassion, humility, and faithfulness. As we journey through Epiphany together, we are invited to look again and to listen more closely. God's light often shines in quiet and ordinary places. When we notice it, we may find ourselves renewed in hope and reminded that God is faithfully at work among us. **Fr Ninus**
