Thought for the week: St Mellitus. Simply Faithful

On 24th of April the church commemorates St Mellitus, a man who quietly helped bring the Christian faith to this country. He came to England in the early 60s, sent as part of a small group of missionaries. There was no power, no army, no control; just faith, patience, and trust in God. Mellitus became the first Bishop of London and later Archbishop of Canterbury. But his journey was not easy. At one point he was forced to leave this land because the faith was rejected. Things did not always go well. And he did not give up. He simply remained faithful. What stands out is not dramatic success, but perseverance. Mellitus reminds us that the work of God often unfolds slowly, through faithful presence. In a world that values quick results and loud victories, his life invites us to remain steadfast even when progress is not visible or uncertain. As we reflect on St Mellitus this week, we are encouraged to think about our own witness. Where are we called to remain faithful, even when it feels unnoticed or difficult? Like Mellitus, we are invited to trust that God is at work, often in hidden ways, and that our role is simply to be present, faithful, and open to His grace. **Fr Ninus**

Electoral Roll Revision
