Thought for the weekend: He is risen indeed. Hallelujah!

The resurrection of Jesus turned the world upside down. For a man to be raised from death was not something new, Jesus had already raised Lazarus from death. But the resurrection of Jesus was something different. The resurrected Jesus was not the same. Jesus was able to appear through locked doors and yet his body bore the wounds and scars of the nails which held him to cross and the spear which the soldiers plunged into his side. The resurrected Jesus ate fish with his disciples and yet they knew that this was no mere resuscitation, Jesus had changed. Jesus was now no longer just Jesus of Nazareth, he was their risen Lord.
