Thought for the weekend: how can we recover after we have a fool of ourselves?

If we are wanting help to answer that question then we can have no better role model than Peter! Nobody would have felt worse about his failure than Peter. He was the disciple who was supremely confident that he could not let Jesus down. Even if everybody else was a disappointment to Jesus, he knew that he would stand firm. So, when he denied Jesus three times the depth of his fall must have been very low. And this was not his first failure. Just after he acknowledged Jesus as the Messiah, the promised one, he tried to prevent Jesus fulfilling his destiny to die for our sins. Oh yes, Peter knew all about making a fool of himself.

In our Holy Gospel reading this weekend, it was to this miserable Peter, full of remorse and bound by past hurt and disappointment, that Jesus came and offered hope. Jesus did not have to forgive Peter, that was already clear from the fact that Jesus endured the suffering of the cross. But Jesus did have to convince poor Peter that he was forgiven, to enable him to move forward and leave behind the past. Of course, it is not just Peter that Jesus speaks to, he speaks to us all and encourages us to move away from the pains and failures of the past and to discover a new and better future. He will make mistakes in our lives, and some of them may be huge. But God forgives us, and will forgive us, if we are prepared to learn from our mistakes-just as Peter did.

OUR PRAYER FOR THE WEEKEND

This is a prayer that, like Peter, we may grow in faith through learning from our mistakes: Heavenly Father, we thank you that our lives are not without meaning and that you have a call for each one of us to be a part of your process of change in the world. Thank you that like Peter we are called by you and receive your strength as we seek to live out your calling for us. Help us to move past our failures and weaknesses so that we might be more faithful and follow you more closely day by day. Amen
