Thought for the week: St Aidan: A Life of Quiet Mission

On 31 August, the Church remembers Aidan of Lindisfarne, one of the great missionaries of the early English Church. Aidan came from the island monastery of Iona and was sent to Northumbria in the seventh century to share the Christian faith.

What is striking about Aidan is not simply what he preached, but how he lived. He travelled from village to village, often on foot, speaking with ordinary people, caring for the poor, teaching children, and freeing those who had been enslaved. His faith was not kept inside a church building. It was seen in the way he treated people.

There is something important here for us. We can sometimes think that mission means having the right words, organising the right events, or persuading people to come to church. Aidan reminds us that mission often begins much more simply: by being present, listening, showing kindness, and allowing Christ to be seen through us.

Aidan's life asks us to consider what kind of Church we are becoming. Are we waiting for people to come to us, or are we willing to meet them where they are?

May Aidan's example encourages us to carry the love of Christ beyond our walls and into the ordinary places of everyday life. **Fr Ninus**
