Thought for the weekend – Sometimes the truth hurts

In our Gospel reading this weekend, Luke describes Jesus's visit to the synagogue in Nazareth. He presented a spiritual manifesto that proclaimed the favour of God and the freedom from sin. His message was that he was sent to heal the broken hearted, preach to the poor, and set free the oppressed. He made a particular call for the people of his hometown to come to the Messiah and be forgiven. The response of those present was far from complimentary. This brings to mind the mixed reactions to the sermon made by Bishop Mariann Edgar Budd during the National Prayer Service held in Washington this last week. The reactions of the crowd, then and now, remind us that not always will we be applauded if we declare our faith, and in so doing speak some uncomfortable home truths. Let us be reassured by the example of Jesus and the bravery of Bishop Mariann and share the good news, even if those around us do not like what they hear. Sometimes the truth hurts, but that does not make it any less true.
