

# THOUGHT FOR THE WEEKEND: What we can learn from Jesus about forgiveness.

Palm Sunday reminds us of how fickle we can all be as human beings. We see the crowd shouting Hosanna, suddenly calling for the death of Jesus. Pontius Pilate is governed by political expediency; Judas betrays Jesus for the prospect of a cash reward. Even His closest disciples move away from Jesus at his time of need and leave him standing alone before the Jewish authorities. Jesus is abandoned.

There is a lesson here for us all. Jesus forgives, he shows compassion and understanding for the weakness of those around him. As we move into Holy Week, are we prepared to follow his example of compassion and forgiveness? Are we willing to keep the faith and also be understanding toward those who are weak and find the going difficult?
