Thought for the weekend: when the going gets tough will we get rough or will we run away?

The Holy Gospel reading from John this week is beautiful. In it, Jesus refers to himself using the illustration of caring for the sheep. Jesus cares for us, but we must be careful! At the end of this teaching, we are told that the Jews wanted to stone Jesus and they would have done if he had not escaped. So why did they want to kill him? It is guite understandable really, Jesus claimed to be God. It was Hannukah 'dedication,' and Jesus was in the Temple area, walking in Solomon's Colonnade. At Hannukah on the 25th day of the Jewish month Chislev, the Jews remembered how in 167 BC Judas Maccabaeus led a revolt to liberate Jerusalem from Antiochus Epiphanes. As a result, Judas and his family became kings in a dynasty which lasted one hundred years. When Herod the Great was made king by the Romans, he married a princess from the family of Judas Maccabaeus to continue the line. So, at Hannukah the Jews celebrated kingship and liberation and thanked God that they had taken the Temple back and restored it. It was at this time that Jesus choose wander in the Temple claiming to be God. The timing was perfect, to create a riot!

What can we learn from this? Jesus could not help but speak out, he knew that his gift was nothing less than eternal life. Jesus could guarantee a future beyond the grave, and there was no way he would be silent. Sometimes, feeble as we are, we will be called to stand out from the crowd and declare our faith. When we are so called, may we have faith sufficient to shine the light for Christ.

God of glory, by the raising of your Son you have broken the chains of death and hell: fill your Church with faith and hope; for a new day has dawned and the way to life stands open in our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen
