Thought for the weekend: Which team would we support?

Jesus chose a special animal for his ride into Jerusalem on that day which we remember this Palm Sunday. Jesus knew the prophecy of Zechariah Chapter 9:9, "Rejoice greatly, O Daughter of Zion! Shout, Daughter of Jerusalem! See, your king comes to you, righteous and having salvation, gentle and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey." It is absolutely clear that Jesus knew he was fulfilling the expectation which the Jewish people had of a Messiah. That is why people sang out Psalm 118, the psalm of praise which pilgrims always sang on the way to Jerusalem. It was a song of victory, a hymn of praise to a God who defeated all his foes and established his kingdom. Jesus knows he is the fulfilment of God's promises, for a king who would bring peace to earth from heaven. Jesus is the salvation of God, but he would soon prove to be a disappointment to the crowd. The crowd who cheered him into Jerusalem would soon cheer instead for Barabbas, when they realised that salvation was about a cross, not overthrowing the Romans. As we enter Holy Week, let us reflect. For whom would we be cheering?

PRAYER FOR THIS WEEKEND: May we be steadfast in prayer: This is a prayer for Palm Sunday, relating it to the way we live and witness: Lord Jesus Christ, whose greatest moments of triumph happen on the back of a donkey's foal and nailed to a bloody cross, may we play our part, and prepare the way for you in our lives and in our world. Amen.
